E. SELECTED NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Corporate information

Biolidics Limited (Registration No. 200913076M) is a limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Singapore. The Company is listed on the Catalist of SGX-ST.

The condensed interim financial statements for 3Q FY2023 and 9M FY2023 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the “**Group**”).

The principal activities of the Group and the Company are those relating to:

- (a) technology development, technology transfer, marketing, sale and distribution of biomedical technology, life and medicine science related products and services;
- (b) provision of laboratory services; and
- (c) investment holding.

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for 3Q FY2023 and 9M FY2023 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) (“**SFRS(I)**”) 1-34 *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group’s financial position and performance of the Group since the last audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022 (“**FY2022**”).

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in Singapore Dollars which is the Company’s functional currency. All financial information presented in Singapore Dollars have been rounded to the nearest thousand, unless otherwise stated.

Material Uncertainty Related to Going Concern

The Group had recorded a net loss of approximately S\$1.55 million and a net operating cash outflow of approximately S\$1.48 million for 9M FY2023. As at 30 September 2023, the Group and the Company was in a net equity deficit position of approximately S\$2.19 million and S\$2.23 million respectively, and was in a negative working capital position of approximately S\$1.37 million and S\$1.39 million respectively. These conditions indicate that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the Group’s ability to continue as a going concern.

To improve the financial health and working capital position of the Group, the Company had completed a renounceable non-underwritten rights issue of new ordinary shares in the issued share capital of the Company (“**Rights Shares**”) in December 2022 (“**Rights Issue**”) pursuant to which the Company raised gross proceeds of approximately S\$5.70 million, before deduction of expenses of approximately S\$0.22 million that was capitalised against the share capital of the Company.

In addition, the Company had on 28 February 2023, entered into a partial settlement deed (“**Partial Settlement Deed**”) with Clearbridge BSA Pte Ltd (“**CBSA**”) to partially settle approximately S\$1.16 million (“**Partial Settlement Sum**”) of the deferred consideration (“**Deferred Consideration**”) (Note 16) owing by the Company to CBSA in connection with the purchase of the entire issued and paid-up share capital of Biomedics Laboratory Pte. Ltd., of which S\$0.55 million of the Partial Settlement Sum (“**Cash Settlement Sum**”) will be settled by way of cash and approximately S\$0.61 million of the Partial Settlement Sum satisfied by way of issuance of 37,500,000 new ordinary shares in the issued share

capital of the Company (“**Consideration Shares**”) at an issue price of S\$0.0163 for each Consideration Share to CBSA. The payment of the Cash Settlement Sum and the issuance of the Consideration Shares to CBSA were completed on 20 March 2023.

As at the date of this announcement, the remaining amount of the Deferred Consideration of S\$2,138,750 owing to CBSA will be payable by the Company to CBSA no later than 25 November 2023 (“**Outstanding Debt**”). In view of the impending due date for the repayment of the Outstanding Debt, the board of directors of the Company (“**Board**”) and management has constantly been exploring opportunities to monetise its assets, including its intellectual properties, as well as fund raising opportunities, including equity issuances.

On 12 October 2023, the Company entered into a subscription agreement (the “**Subscription Agreement**”) with Mr. Zhu Hua (the “**Subscriber**”) for the proposed subscription of 230,769,231 new ordinary shares in the issued share capital of the Company (“**Subscription Shares**”) at an issue price of S\$0.0065 per Subscription Share (“**Proposed Subscription**”), to raise gross proceeds of S\$1.50 million (“**Subscription Amount**”). The Company intends to utilise the net proceeds of approximately S\$1.39 million from the Proposed Subscription to partially repay the Outstanding Debt. The balance amount of the Outstanding Debt of approximately S\$0.75 million is to be repaid using a combination of (i) S\$0.50 million of the net proceeds which has been allocated for such purpose from the Rights Issue, and (ii) approximately S\$0.25 million from the Group’s internal resources. The Proposed Subscription will be subject to the approval of shareholders of the Company at an extraordinary general meeting to be convened on 21 November 2023.

Following the completion of the Proposed Subscription, the Subscriber intends to undertake a strategic review of the Group’s existing business and recommend new businesses, where appropriate, to the Board. The Subscriber has also undertaken to provide financial support to the Group by way of, *inter alia*, interest-free shareholder’s loans to ensure that the Company and the Group will be able to continue to operate as a going concern. The quantum of such financial support is to be mutually agreed between the Company and the Subscriber following the completion of the strategic review of the Group’s existing businesses.

To support that the financial statements of the Group have been prepared on a going concern basis and to ensure the adequacy of funds required to meet its obligations, working capital and capital commitment needs, the Group has prepared a consolidated cash flow forecast for a 12-month period from 1 October 2023 to 30 September 2024 (“**Cash Flow Forecast**”). In preparing the Cash Flow Forecast, management has taken the following into consideration:

- the challenges faced by the cancer business during the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact of the emergence of competing and newer technologies on the sales of COVID-19 related products in the infectious diseases business;
- the forecasted cash flow from the laboratory services business;
- the cost cutting measures that the Group has put in place to manage costs; and
- subject to the completion of the Proposed Subscription, the Subscription Amount and the provision of the financial support from the Subscriber.

After taking into consideration the Cash Flow Forecast, the Board is of the opinion that the Group and the Company will be able to operate as a going concern and that the use of the going concern assumption in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements of the Group for 9M FY2023 is appropriate.

In the event that the Proposed Subscription is not completed and/or the Subscriber does not provide, or is unable to provide, sufficient financial support to the Group for its working capital requirements, the Group will look for alternative sources of funding such as equity or debt fundraising through a placement of securities of the Company to investors or other fundraising opportunities to raise the requisite funding for the repayment of the Outstanding Debt and/or for the Group’s working capital

requirements. Should the Group fail to raise such alternative funding, the Company and the Group may not be able to operate as a going concern and trading of the Shares may be suspended pursuant to Rule 1303(3) of the Catalyst Rules

If the going concern assumption is no longer appropriate, adjustments may have to be made to reflect the situation that assets may need to be realised other than in the normal course of business and at amounts which may differ significantly from the amounts at which they are currently recorded in the statements of financial position. In addition, the Group and the Company may have to reclassify non-current assets and liabilities as current assets and liabilities, respectively. Such adjustments have not been made to these financial statements.

2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group

The Group has applied the same accounting policies and methods of computation in the preparation of the condensed interim financial statements for 3Q FY2023 and 9M FY2023 as compared to those applied in the audited financial statements for FY2022 except for the adoption of new or revised SFRS(I) and Interpretations of Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (“**SFRS(I) INT**”) that are mandatory for financial years beginning on or after 1 January 2023. The Group has adopted all applicable SFRS(I) and SFRS(I) INT that are mandatory for financial years beginning on or after 1 January 2023. The adoption of these SFRS(I) and SFRS(I) INT has no significant impact on the Group’s consolidated financial statements.

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates

The preparation of the Group’s consolidated financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the end of each reporting period. Uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in the future periods.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group’s accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the audited financial statements for FY2022.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about critical judgements in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements is as follows:

- Identification of a cash-generating unit (“**CGU**”) - Management identified the Group’s cancer business and laboratory services business as the 2 CGUs in the Group, having considered the products and services being sold by the Group and the inter-dependency of the cashflows arising from the products and services provided within a CGU.

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting period are discussed below. The Group based its assumptions and estimates on parameters available when the financial statements were prepared. Existing circumstances and assumptions about future developments, however, may change due to market changes or circumstances arising beyond the control of the Group. Such changes are reflected in the assumptions when they occur.

- Expected credit losses (“ECLs”)

The Group uses a provision matrix to calculate ECLs for trade receivables. The provision rates are based on days past due for groupings of various customer segments that have similar loss patterns. The provision matrix is initially based on the Group’s historical observed default rates. The Group will calibrate the matrix to adjust historical credit loss experience with forward-looking information. At every reporting date, historical default rates are updated and changes in the forward-looking estimates are analysed. The assessment of the correlation between historical observed default rates, forecast economic conditions and ECLs is a significant estimate. The amount of ECLs is sensitive to changes in circumstances and of forecast economic conditions. The Group’s historical credit loss experience and forecast of economic conditions may also not be representative of customer’s actual default in the future. As at 30 September 2023, the carrying amount of the Group’s trade receivables was approximately S\$0.16 million (31 December 2022: S\$0.52 million).

In determining the loss allowance for amount due from subsidiaries, when measuring ECL, loss given default constitutes a key input in measuring ECL. Loss given default is an estimate of the loss arising on default. It is based on the difference between the contractual cash flows due and those that the lender would expect to receive. As at 30 September 2023, the carrying amount of the Company’s receivables due from subsidiaries was approximately S\$0.35 million (31 December 2022: S\$0.42 million).

- Impairment assessment of plant and equipment and right-of-use assets

Management has carried out a review and determined that there are indicators of impairment for the Group’s plant and equipment and right-of-use assets. These assets belong to the Group’s Cancer and Laboratory Services CGUs that also form the respective operating segments. The Group determines the recoverable amount of the assets of the Cancer and Laboratory Services CGUs based on the higher of value-in-use and fair value less cost of disposals. The recoverable amount of these assets as at 31 December 2022 have been determined based on their fair value less cost of disposal. The fair value less cost of disposal of the CGUs’ assets as at 31 December 2022 have been estimated by management, with the assistance of external valuers and are categorised in Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy. The valuation techniques, key assumptions and inputs are provided in the table below and the sources of information include the financial forecasts prepared by management, historical information and external data. Significant judgement has been applied by management in determining the adjustment for economic obsolescence. The Group concluded that no impairment loss is to be recognised in 9M FY2023.

- Impairment assessment of investment in subsidiaries

Management has carried out a review and determined that there are indicators of impairment of the Company’s investments in subsidiaries. The recoverable amount of the investments as at 31 December 2022 has been estimated based on fair value less cost of disposal (2021: value-in-use) of the relevant CGU’s assets as disclosed in Note 3.2(b) above with adjustments to arrive at equity value of the investments. As at 30 September 2023, the carrying amount of the Company’s investment in subsidiaries was Nil (31 December 2022: Nil).

3. Seasonal operations

The Group’s businesses were not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during 3Q FY2023 and 9M FY2023.

4. Revenue

The Group derives its revenue from the transfer of goods and services over time and at a point in time in the following major revenue streams. This is consistent with the revenue information that is disclosed for each reportable segment under SFRS(I) 8 (see Note 22).

The basis for the Disclaimer of Opinion is in relation to (i) the use of the Group's going concern assumption and (ii) the impairment assessment of the Group's plant and equipment, right-of-use assets, intangible assets and goodwill (collectively, "**long-lived assets**"), and the Company's investments in, and other receivable due from, a wholly-owned subsidiary or the Company, Biomedics Laboratory Pte Ltd ("**BML**").

(i) Use of the Group's going concern assumption

To improve the financial health and working capital position of the Group, the Company has completed the Rights Issue in December 2022, raising gross proceeds of approximately S\$5.70 million, before deduction of expenses of approximately S\$0.22 million that was capitalised against the share capital of the Company. The Company also improved the liquidity and working capital position of the Group through the Partial Settlement Deed pursuant to which approximately S\$0.61 million of the Deferred Consideration was settled by way of the issuance of the Consideration Shares to CBSA.

On 12 October 2023, the Company entered into the Subscription Agreement with the Subscriber in relation to the Proposed Subscription, to raise gross proceeds of S\$1.50 million. The Company intends to utilise the net proceeds of approximately S\$1.39 million from the Proposed Subscription to partially repay the Outstanding Debt. The Proposed Subscription will be subject to the approval of shareholders of the Company at an extraordinary general meeting to be convened on 21 November 2023.

Following the completion of the Proposed Subscription, the Subscriber intends to undertake a strategic review of the Group's existing business and recommend new businesses, where appropriate, to the Board. The Subscriber has also undertaken to provide financial support to the Group by way of, *inter alia*, interest-free shareholder's loans to ensure that the Company and the Group will be able to continue to operate as a going concern. The quantum of such financial support is to be mutually agreed between the Company and the Subscriber following the completion of the strategic review of the Group's existing businesses.

As disclosed under Note 2 under Section E - Selected notes to the financial statements of this announcement, management has prepared the Group's and the Company's financial statements for 9M FY2023 on the basis that the Group and the Company will be able to carry on as a going concern for at least twelve months from the end of 9M FY2023 based on factors disclosed in that note.

Revenue decreased by 14.6% or S\$0.21 million, from S\$1.45 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$1.24 million in 9M FY2023, due mainly to a decrease in sales of our COVID-19 related products which amounted to Nil in 9M FY2023, as compared to S\$0.34 million in 9M FY2022, arising from a growing supply of antigen and antibody test kits which led to a highly competitive market under the constraints of intense price competition.

The decrease was partially offset by an increase in revenue from the sales of our ClearCell® FX1 system, our CTChip® FR1 biochip and other related services and consumables from S\$0.13 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.18 million in 9M FY2023. Revenue from rendering of laboratory services also increased from S\$0.98 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$1.05 million in 9M FY2023. The increase in revenue from rendering of laboratory services was due to an increase in PCR test services in the 3 months financial period ended 31 March 2023 as we provided PCR test services on a 24/7 basis and demand arising from the increase in the number of travelers from the People's Republic of China.

Revenue decreased by 94.6% or S\$0.72 million, from S\$0.77 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.04 million in 3Q FY2023, due mainly to a decrease in revenue from rendering of laboratory services from S\$0.75 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.03 million in 3Q FY2023. The decrease in revenue from the rendering of laboratory services was due to a decrease in PCR test services arising from the lack of demand resulting from the changes in travel policies. Since March 2023, PCR tests are no longer required for travelers into many countries. Revenue from sale of our COVID-19 related products were nil for both 3Q FY2023 and 3Q FY2022.

Other income

Other income decreased by 76.1% or S\$0.25 million, from S\$0.33 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.08 million in 9M FY2023, due mainly to a decrease of S\$0.17 million in government grants and a decrease in foreign exchange gains of S\$0.10 million.

Other income remained relatively unchanged at S\$0.05 million in 3Q FY2023 and 3Q FY2022.

Changes in inventories

We recorded an increase of S\$0.15 million in the closing balance of our inventories in 9M FY2023, as compared to a decrease of S\$0.12 million in 9M FY2022, and an increase of S\$3,000 and a decrease of S\$0.02 million in the closing balances of our inventories in 3Q FY2023 and 3Q FY2022 respectively. The fluctuations in the balance of our inventories were due mainly to the timing of purchase and sale of inventories.

Purchases

Our purchases decreased by S\$0.02 million or 2.4%, from S\$0.74 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.72 million in 9M FY2023, and by S\$0.33 million or 94.1%, from S\$0.35 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.02 million in 3Q FY2023, in line with the decrease in revenue from rendering of laboratory services during the respective financial periods.

Employee benefits expense

Employee benefits expense decreased by S\$0.58 million or 31.4%, from S\$1.84 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$1.26 million in 9M FY2023, and by \$0.22 million or 36.1%, from S\$0.61 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.39 million 3Q FY2023, due mainly to a reduction of headcount in March 2023.

Depreciation expense

Depreciation expense decreased by S\$0.46 million or 72.2%, from S\$0.64 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.18 million in 9M FY2023 and by S\$0.17 million or 81.6%, from S\$0.21 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.04 million in 3Q FY2023, due to assets being fully depreciated and/ or impaired in FY2022.

Amortisation expense

Amortisation expense decreased by S\$0.32 million or 100.0% in 9M FY2023 and by S\$0.11 million or 100.0% in 3Q FY2023, due to intangible assets being fully impaired in FY2022.

Research and development (“R&D”) expense

R&D expense decreased by 98.0% or S\$0.19 million, from S\$0.20 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.01 million in 9M FY2023, and by 93.3% or S\$0.28 million, from S\$0.03 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$2,000 in 3Q FY2023, due mainly to the reduction in R&D activities during the respective financial periods.

Other expenses

Other expenses decreased by 23.8% or S\$0.24 million, from S\$0.99 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.76 million in 9M FY2023, due mainly to a decrease in professional fees (cash-settled) of S\$0.07 million and reversal of allowance of inventories on S\$0.07 million.

Other expenses decreased by 39.8% or S\$0.14 million, from S\$0.34 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.21 million in 9M FY2023, due mainly to reversal of allowance of inventories, reversal of provision for unconsumed leave and lower repair and maintenance cost.

Finance costs

Finance costs decreased by 28.7% or S\$0.04 million, from S\$0.13 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$0.09 million in 9M FY2023, and by 32.5% or S\$0.01 million, from S\$0.04 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.03 million in 3Q FY2023, due mainly to the lower balances of borrowings and deferred consideration.

Income tax credit

Income tax credit pertains to the reversal of deferred tax liabilities arising from the CAP Accreditation of Biomedics Laboratory Pte. Ltd.. There was no income tax credit recognised in 9M FY2023 and 3Q FY2023 as the deferred tax liabilities was fully reversed in FY2022 arising from fair valuation of the intangible assets.

Loss for the period

As a result of the foregoing, loss for the period decreased by S\$1.61 million or 51.0%, from S\$3.16 million in 9M FY2022 to S\$1.55 million in 9M FY2023, and by S\$0.28 million or 31.7%, from S\$0.88 million in 3Q FY2022 to S\$0.60 million in 3Q FY2023.

REVIEW OF THE GROUP'S FINANCIAL POSITION

Non-current assets

The Group's non-current assets decreased by 56.0% or S\$0.09 million, from S\$0.17 million as at 31 December 2022 to S\$0.07 million as at 30 September 2023. The was due to a decrease in plant and equipment and right-of-use assets of S\$0.05 million and S\$0.04 million respectively, which arose mainly from the depreciation and amortisation charges during the period.

Current assets

The Group's current assets decreased by 57.6% or S\$3.41 million, from S\$5.92 million as at 31 December 2022 to S\$2.51 million as at 30 September 2023. This was due mainly to a decrease in (i) cash and cash equivalents of S\$3.02 million; (ii) trade receivables of S\$0.36 million; (iii) prepayments of S\$0.07 million; and (iv) other receivables of S\$0.12 million, partially offset by an increase in inventories of S\$0.15 million.

Current liabilities

The Group's current liabilities decreased by 35.4% or S\$2.13 million, from S\$6.01 million as at 31 December 2022 to S\$3.88 million as at 30 September 2023. This was due mainly to a decrease in (i) deferred consideration of S\$1.11 million; (ii) other payables of S\$0.79 million; (iii) trade payables of S\$0.08 million, (iv) contract liabilities of S\$0.10 million, and (v) current portion of lease liabilities of S\$0.06 million, partially offset by an increase in current portion of borrowings of S\$0.02 million.

Non-current liabilities

The Group's non-current liabilities decreased by 49.0% or S\$0.87 million, from S\$1.77 million as at 31 December 2022 to S\$0.09 million as at 30 September 2023. This was due mainly to a decrease in (i) borrowings of S\$0.81 million comprising the non-current portion of working capital bank loans; and (ii) non-current portion of lease liabilities of S\$0.06 million.

REVIEW OF THE GROUP'S CASH FLOW STATEMENT

Operating cash outflow before movements in working capital amounted to S\$1.32 million in 9M FY2023. Net cash used for working capital amounted to S\$0.15 million due mainly to (i) an increase in inventories of S\$0.13 million; (ii) a decrease in trade payables of S\$0.08 million, (iii) a decrease in other payables of S\$0.37 million; and (iv) a decrease in contract liabilities of S\$0.10 million, partially offset by (i) a decrease in trade receivables of S\$0.35 million; (ii) a decrease in prepayments of S\$0.07 million; and (iii) a decrease in other receivables of S\$0.12 million. As a result, net cash used in operating activities was S\$1.48 million in 9M FY2023.

Net cash used in investing activities in 9M FY2023 amounted to S\$0.55 million. This was due mainly to partial payment of the Deferred Consideration of S\$0.55 million in cash.

Net cash used in financing activities in 9M FY2023 amounted to S\$0.99 million. This was due mainly to the payment of S\$0.79 million and S\$0.21 million of the principal portions of borrowings and lease liabilities respectively in 9M FY2023.

As a result of the above, there was a net decrease in cash and cash equivalents by S\$3.02 million, from S\$5.03 million as at 31 December 2022 to S\$2.01 million as at 30 September 2023.

In FY2022, the Group's commenced COVID-19 PCR testing as one of its service offerings which it will continue to offer in the current financial year ending 31 December 2023.

As set out under Note 8 under Section F – Other information required under the Catalist Rules of this announcement, revenue from rendering of COVID-19 PCR test services accounted for more than 80% of the Group's revenue in 9M FY2023. However, due to the rapidly evolving nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, the demand for COVID-19 PCR tests continues to be exposed to various uncertainties and challenges such as the emergence of competing and newer technologies, product regulatory changes, and changes in travel policies and restrictions as well as emergence of new competitors providing similar PCR test services. As such, there is no certainty that such revenue from rendering of COVID-19 PCR test services can be maintained at the level achieved in 9M FY2023. The Group will continue to explore opportunities to generate revenue from its laboratory services business segment by pivoting into other test services, subject to the requisite time to develop and obtain the relevant approvals required to undertake such new test services.

The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in significant delays to the Group's development of its Cancer business segment. The Group will continue to review its product and service offerings in order to keep pace with the uncertainties and challenges and ensure that the Group's business remains relevant and sustainable. The Group will also continue to explore merger and acquisition opportunities to improve its financial performance.

To manage the challenges and uncertainties, including rising cost of conducting business, the Group has since June 2022 implemented cost rationalisation measures such as streamlining of its manpower structure, scaling down of the R&D activities for its Cancer business segment, and reducing the engagement of external service providers.

To strengthen its financial position, the Group has completed the Rights Issue in December 2022 and may explore opportunities to monetise its assets, including its intellectual properties which is encapsulated in the ClearCell® FX1 system as well as fund raising opportunities, including undertaking equity issuances in the future. The Company had also on 12 October 2023, entered into the Subscription Agreement with the Subscriber in relation to the Proposed Subscription, to raise gross proceeds of S\$1.50 million. The Company intends to utilise the net proceeds of approximately S\$1.39 million from the Proposed Subscription to partially repay the Outstanding Debt. The Proposed Subscription will be subject to the approval of shareholders of the Company at an extraordinary general meeting to be convened on 21 November 2023.

Following the completion of the Proposed Subscription, the Subscriber intends to undertake a strategic review of the Group's existing business and recommend new businesses, where appropriate, to the Board. The Subscriber has also undertaken to provide financial support to the Group by way of, *inter alia*, interest-free shareholder's loans to ensure that the Company and the Group will be able to continue to operate as a going concern. The quantum of such financial support is to be mutually agreed between the Company and the Subscriber following the completion of the strategic review of the Group's existing businesses.

The Company will continue to provide timely updates to its shareholders should there be any material development affecting the Group's business and operations.
